TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS AND ETIQUETTE

The **4th Annual Arizona International Open Bocce Tournament** will be played according to the freestyle league regulations. Teams will be comprised of four (4) players + one (1) substitute. No changes in team rosters will be made after the beginning of the first match.

1. Teams will play double elimination. Games will go to 11 points each.
2. Teams arriving late for tournament play will lose one point for every five (5) minutes. After one hour, the entire match will be forfeited.
3. Teams may practice before each game of a match. Practice will consist of players rolling appropriate number of balls one time from each end of the court.
4. A Neutral Official will judge each match. Final game will be observed/officiated by tournament directors.
5. Only the players may enter the court during tournament play. Time outs may be called during a game only by the team captain. Time outs may not exceed two (2) minutes. No more than two time outs may be called by a team in any one game.
6. Team captains are responsible for signing score cards and returning those cards and all equipment to the tournament official after every match.
7. Team captains are responsible for the actions of their players. Drinking and smoking are not permitted on the court. Players wishing to leave the court momentarily must first notify the opposing team captain.
8. Players may not apply any foreign substance to the balls.
9. Courtesy and respect should be displayed at all times. When a player is about to play his ball, all others should remain silent. Profanity and unsportsmanlike conduct are not permitted. Violations will result in a warning by the official tournament referee to the player and the team captain. Severe violations or a violation after a warning has already been given will result in the player's expulsion from that game by the official tournament referee.
10. Any ball that touches the back board is then considered "dead," unless another ball (or pallino) makes contact, then the ball is still in play.
11. No substitutions allowed once the game starts. If a substitute must replace a regular team member, they will replace regular team member **for the remainder of the tournament.**

12. If a team does not have a substitute, the tournament director will select one if needed for that team.
 13. All teams will play double elimination.
 14. All teams will play a partial round.
 15. All games will be played to 11 points.
 16. The championship game will be played to 13 points.
 17. Team rankings will be based on total wins. Ties will be broken (first) by total points, (second) by points scored against and (last) by coin toss.
 18. Losers of the semi-final will play for third and fourth place. Winners will play for first and second place.
 19. The team who wins the toss will have two chances to throw the pallino. After throwing twice, the opposite team will be allowed to throw the pallino; and the team who initially won the toss will be allowed to throw the first ball.

20. When the pallino returns from the center of the course, the same team starts again.
 21. Tournament directors reserve the right to use discretion on modification of any of the above to ensure a fun, safe, and competitive tournament.
